The storm terrified the disciples. Waves covered the boat, filling it with water. But Jesus was sound asleep on a pillow, asleep in the storm. The



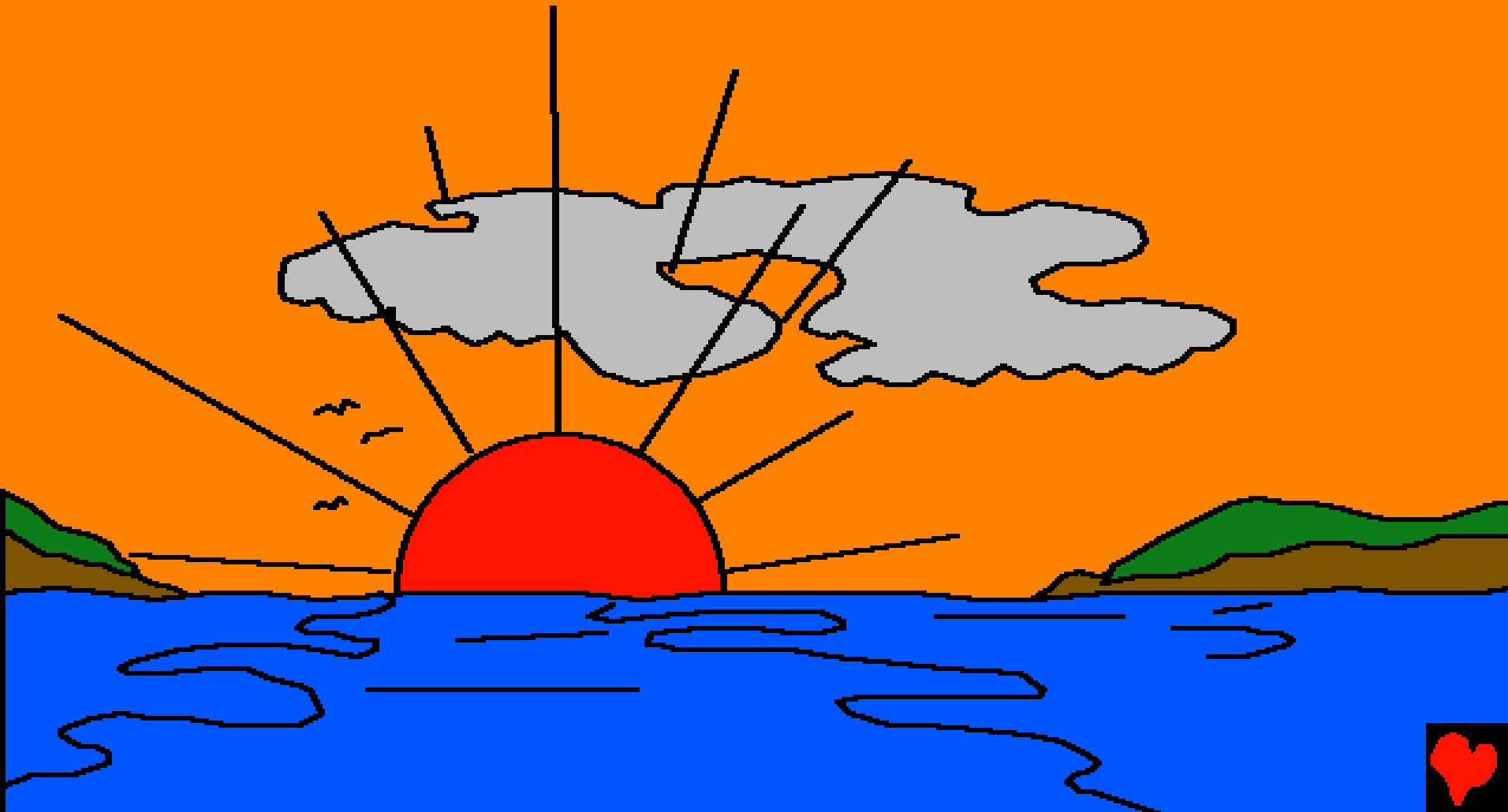

perishing!"



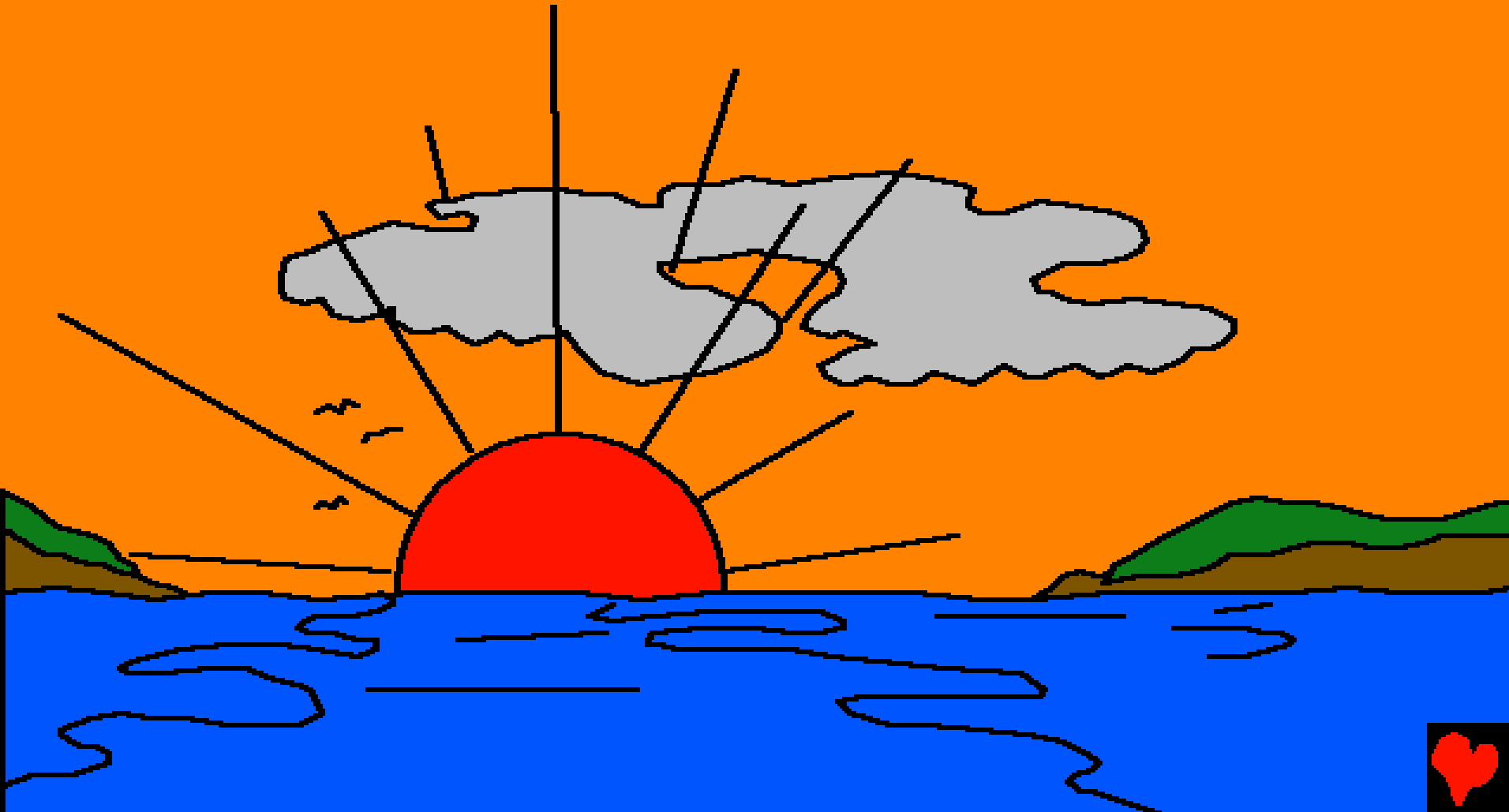

PEACEFUL AND STILL.



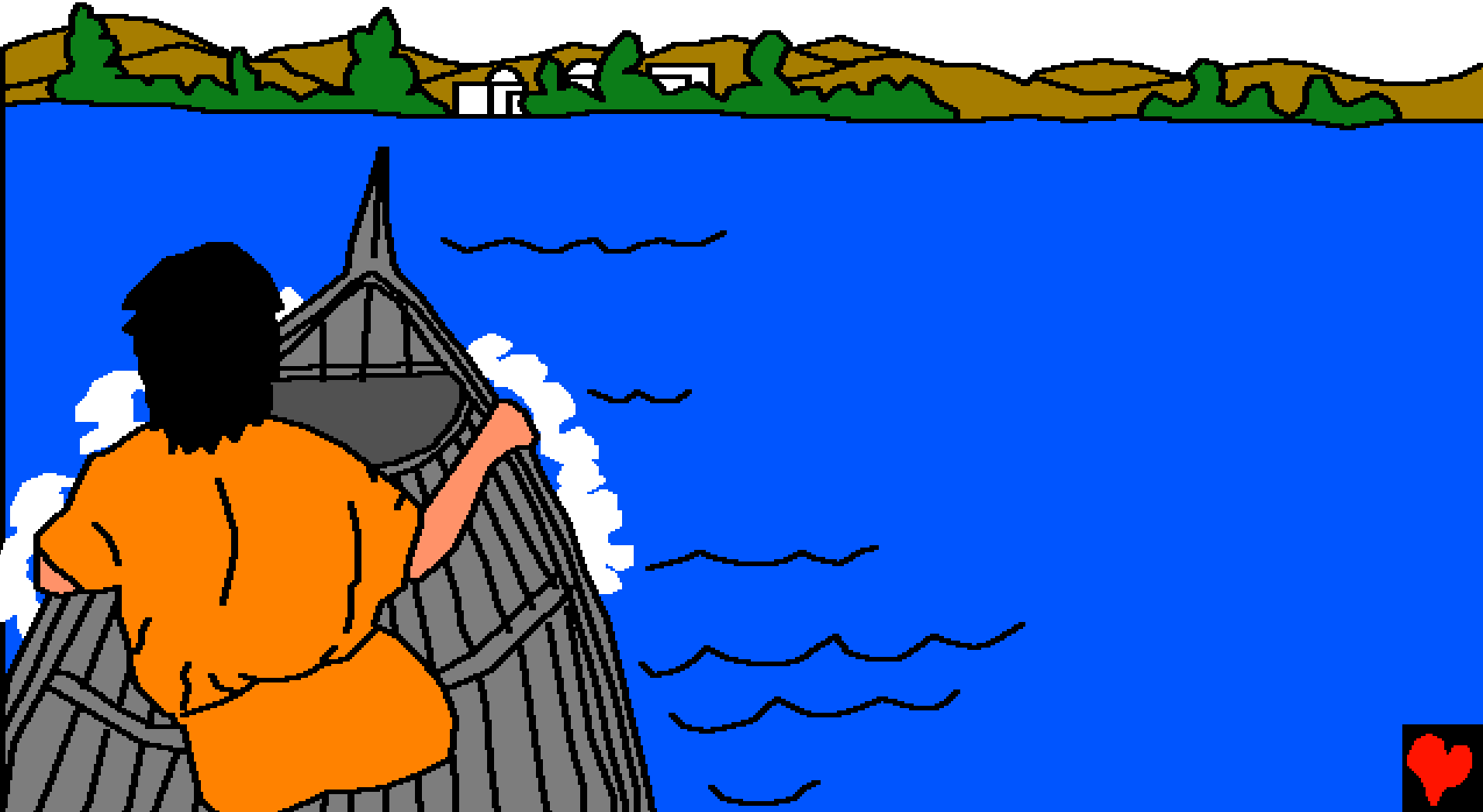
The disciples marveled, saying, "Who can this be, that even the winds and the sea obey Him!"

walked toward Jesus.

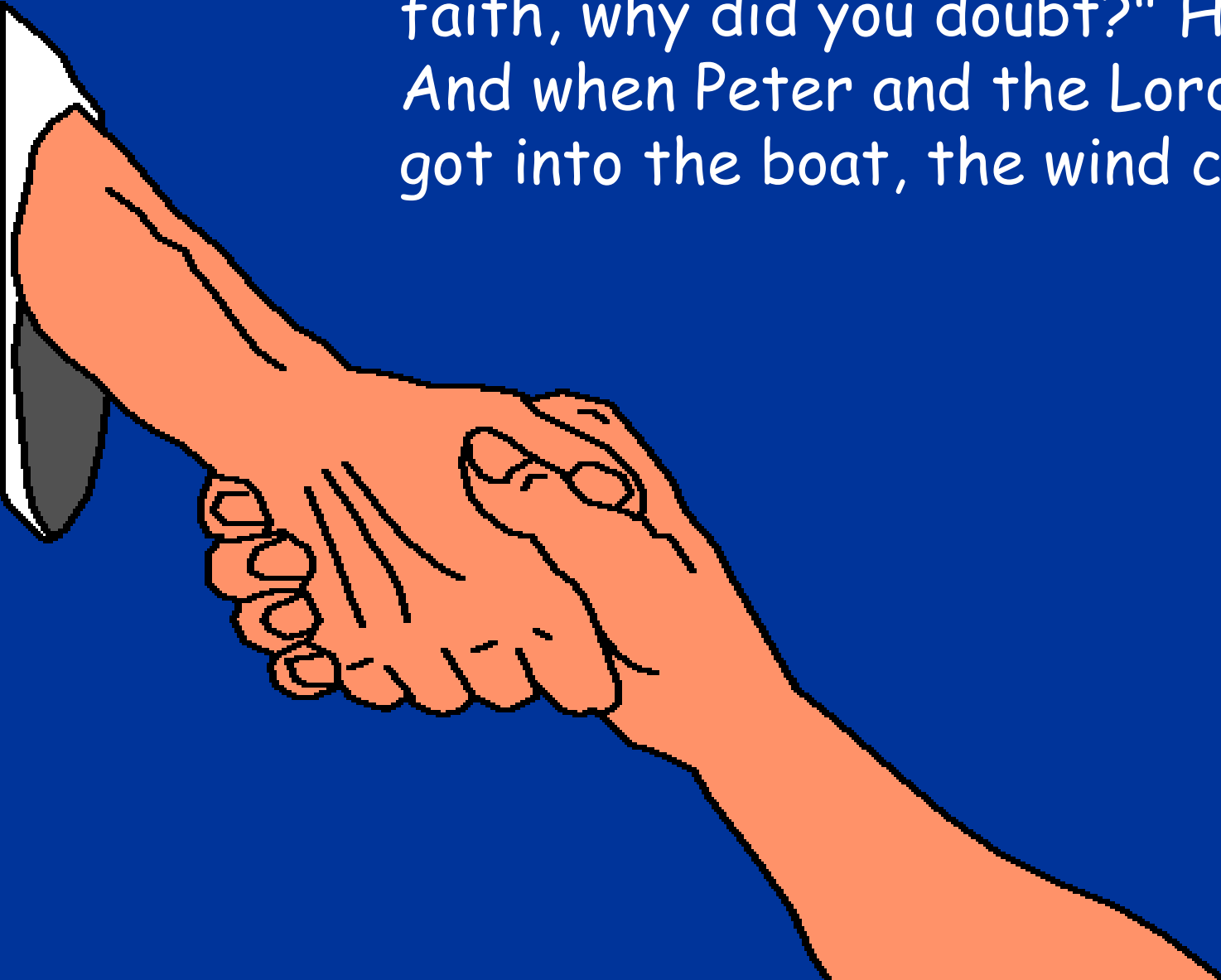




But when he saw
